Investigative police reports are generally <u>NOT RELEASED</u> to the public under any of the following circumstances, if:

The incident is under active investigation.
The incident is under active prosecution.
The information sought is available through discovery or from other sources (i.e. County Court, States Attorney's office, etc.)
The investigative police report was generated by another agency.
The investigative police report contains information, which may compromise another ongoing investigation.
The investigative police report involves juvenile subjects (unless it is the parent, guardian or juvenile requesting the Police Investigative Report).
The investigative police report contains photographs of dead bodies.
The disclosure of the investigative police report would thwart governmental processes by discouraging citizens from giving the government information.
The release of the investigative police report will have an impact, on any people who have given information, if their identities are disclosed.
The degree to which government self-evaluation and consequent program improvement will be chilled by disclosure.
The information sought is factual data or evaluative summary.
The party seeking the discovery is an actual or potential defendant in any criminal proceeding either pending or reasonably likely to follow from the incident in question.
The police investigation has not been completed and approved by a supervisor.
There are disciplinary proceedings that may arise from the investigation.
The plaintiff's suit is frivolous and not brought in good faith.
The information sought in the case is not pertinent or vital.
